

**A DAY IN SALISBURY**

**MEETING PLACE** “The Mill” in Bridge Street, as indicated on the map, does not open until 11.00. Instead we will MEET in **The Kings Head**, a Wetherspoon’s pub, Bridge Street opposite the Mill. The entrance is round the corner facing the River.

**Rail Travellers.** The 09.27 from Clapham Junction is “off peak” and, with a rail card, the day return fare is £22.50. (I do not know the status of this train leaving Waterloo at 09.20) From the station walk towards the City Centre, (down the slope and right at the mini roundabout), through a dismal part of Salisbury crossing a small river, past City Hall and over the Avon. The King’s Head is facing you on the right. 5 to 10 minutes walk.

**Car travellers** enter the City at your peril as it is crowded and there are road works with diversions to confuse you more.

The **Itinerary** will depend on the weather and how we get on as most of the tour will be in the open. Please dress appropriately. Our guide, Penny May, is flexible about what we want to look at. There is far more to see than the time will allow.

**Cathedral Tower** tour has 350 steps and takes 1½ hours. If you do not wish to go on the tour please tell me lunch time. I have booked one private tour for 12 of us. If more than 12 wish to go up then the rest can go on an earlier public tour. Penny will take us on a tour of the Cathedral.

Lunch will be taken at **The Cloisters**, a pub just outside the Close. Local Salisbury beer and standard pub food.
