VISIT TO ASTRIUM STEVENAGE FRIDAY 22 FEBRUARY 2008

A visit is being arranged to the Stevenage site. This is the home of Astrium and Paradigm Secure Communications. It is located 50km north of London. The site assembled Blue Streak missiles in the 1950s and now houses Astrium's spacecraft design and build facility and the headquarters of Paradigm Secure Communications. There are 1200 employees at this site. The activities include: structure and subsystem design and build for all Eurostar communications satellites; prime contractor for science missions such as Beagle 2 Mars lander, Rosetta and Lisa Pathfinder prime contractor for EO satellites like Aeolus; the management and operation of the UK MOD's Skynet 5 satellite system.

Astrium is located at Gunnels Wood Road, Stevenage, SG1 2AS. From A1/M take the exit 7 Stevenage/ A602. Follow Stevenage, and then at the roundabout take the first exit to the Industrial Area, which is Gunnels Wood Road (A1072)

The site is also close to Stevenage Railway station.

The visit will start at 10.30 and finish at 16.00. Numbers are limited to 20. The full programme and detailed reporting instructions will be available nearer the date. You will have to take a means of identification such as your passport. Non-UK passport holders will have to give me their nationality and passport number before the visit.
